COMPLAINT AGAINST POLICE

I write in response to your correspondence with your complaint against police.

Your complaint has been formally recorded within the provisions of Part 2 of the Police Reform Act 2002.

My role in dealing with your complaint is to decide how the matter should be dealt with.

Based on the information contained within your correspondence, I have determined that some elements of your complaint are suitable to be dealt with at a local police level. Therefore, papers in relation to this have been forwarded to your local neighbourhood Inspector, who will allocate an officer to contact you and endeavour to resolve your complaint.

The other matters which you raise are directly related to the case which is currently under investigation, therefore cannot be dealt with at this stage. Once the investigation and any subsequent criminal proceedings have finished, I will write to you again in order that the remaining elements of your complaint can be progressed.

Should you object to the decision to suspend the handling of your complaint, you may ask the IOPC to consider whether to direct that the complaint handling continue.
